Mishima croquettes are a local delicacy made from 100% Mishima potatoes grown in the western foothills of Hakone. Enjoy a variety of flavors at each store.



### Shiitake Mushroom Soba

Our specialty shiitake mushroom soba topped with plenty of shiitake mushrooms from Izu stewed in-house. We use raw soba, which is rare near the station.

### Onsen Manju (Onsen Manju Shake)

This azuki bean paste shake, made with Tanna milk and topped with an entire onsen manju steamed bun (a specialty of Izunokuni City), is an exquisite treat.

### Mishima Bagna

This bagna cauda is made with Hakone Seiroku Mishima vegetables, which are highly regarded commercially, and is served at restaurants in Mishima City. Enjoy the combination of fresh vegetables and special sauce, which varies from restaurant to restaurant.



### Mishima Eel

Mishima eel is exposed to the subsoil waters of Mt. Fuji for about a week, which removes fishy odors and excess fat, giving it a luxurious taste.



### Tanna Milk (tap yogurt)

This drinking yogurt was created by a 130-year-old milk brand. Milk from cows raised in this rich natural setting delivers outstanding taste and quality.

### Strawberry Picking

The strawberries that grow in the rich natural environment of the Tagata Plain are excellent. The strawberry varieties principally cultivated are Benihoppe, Akihime, and Kiripika.



### Wasabi (Wasabi soft serve ice cream)

Delicious milky soft serve ice cream topped with freshly grated Izu wasabi. Freshly grated wasabi is less pungent, and has a sweeter taste.



### Aminyon Yaki

These baked sweets are shaped like the face of the Seated Amida Nyorai statue at the Kannami Buddha Statues Museum. Featuring dough made with Tanna Milk buttermilk, they are available in two flavors: white butter bean paste or red bean paste.

### How to buy a Train ticket

- Use the fare table to find the fare from the station where you board to your destination station.
- Press the fare button ① on the ticket vending machine.
- The fare is half-price for children from ages 6 to 12. Press the "Child" button, and then press the half-price button ①. (\*1)
- Put money into the machine and your ticket will be issued.
- Pass the ticket through the ticket gate to enter the station. (Take care not to forget your ticket!)(\*2)

## Rakujuen Park

A city park with a rich natural setting. Designated a national natural monument and place of scenic beauty because of its magnificent garden making use of spring water from Mt. Fuji and the natural forest setting.

## Sano Art Museum

The museum holds exhibitions on a variety of themes, including Japanese swords. The museum's circuit-style Japanese garden, with its weeping cherry blossoms, azaleas, and autumn leaves, is a great spot to enjoy the changing seasons.

## Mishima Taisha Shrine

The first shrine in Izu Province where Minamoto-no-Yoritomo prayed for the revival of the Minamoto (Genji) clan. The main hall is built in the majestic Gongen-zukuri style. Weeping cherry blossoms bloom by the sacred pond in spring, and fragrant olive trees estimated to be over 1,200 years old brighten up the grounds in autumn.

## Genbe River

Enjoy a walk along the river while sensing the subterranean waters flowing from Mount Fuji. In early summer, you can watch fireflies too.

# Izu-Nagaoka Onsen

(Kona Onsen, Nagaoka Onsen)

With a history of about 1,300 years, Kona Onsen is one of the three oldest hot springs in Izu. It is said that Minamoto-no-Yoritomo, who was exiled to Izu to spare his life, bathed in this park.



## Road Station Izu Gateway Kannami

A facility that brings together all the appeal of Izu, such as a restaurant serving local Izu produce, stores that really make you feel the charm of Izu, and a helpful information center.

## Izu Wasabi Museum

## Izu Hakone Railway Heart-shaped strap

A blessed spot for love  
Of the 1,812 hand-straps in the 10 trains that operate on the Izu Hakone Line, only one is heart-shaped. Its location is undisclosed, and rail maintenance workers move it around at irregular intervals. Maybe it'll bring you happiness when you encounter it?



## Nirayama Reverberatory Furnace

This cannon casting furnace, with its brick chimneys standing 15.7 meters high, was one of the most advanced factories in Japan at the end of the Edo period. In 2015, it was included on the World Heritage List as an element of "Sites of Japan's Meiji Industrial Revolution: Iron and Steel, Shipbuilding and Coal Mining".

## Egawa Residence

This nationally designated Important Cultural Property was the birthplace of Egawa Hidetatsu Tarozaemon, who was active at the end of the Edo period. The main building is a magnificent frame supporting a large roof over 12 meters high, whose structure can be seen from the earthen floor.

This facility, which uses natural ocean waters, is home to dolphins, sea lions, penguins, and other marine creatures that inhabit Suruga Bay.

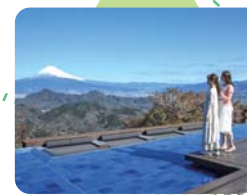

This vast park, the size of 10 Tokyo Domes, contains several zones that truly make the most of the landscape, such as the English Village, Canadian Village, and Japanese Garden, where visitors can enjoy nature and flowers in every season.

## Shigetsu-den

(Grave of Minamoto-no-Yorrie)

Said to be the oldest wooden structure in Izu, this prayer hall was donated to Shuzenji Temple by Masako Hojo to pray for the soul of her son Yorrie, who was assassinated.

## River Terrace Sugi-no-yu

The footbath overlooks the Katsura River and Tokko-no-yu Spa.

## Tokko-no-yu Spa

(ornamental)  
This is the origin of Shuzenji Onsen, the oldest hot spring in Izu.

## Chikurin-no-komichi (Bamboo Grove Path)

A soothing walking trail along the Katsura River, which runs through the center of the hot spring town.

## Shuzenji Temple

A famous temple said to have been founded by Kobo Daishi, this is the origin of the Shuzenji Onsen waters, as well as the setting for the rise and fall of the Minamoto (Genji) clan in the Kamakura period. The temple was founded 1,200 years ago, and has been awarded two Michelin stars.
